Comments / Explanations:

RACE 1 – LADBROKES MATES MODE 3YO MAIDEN (1220 METRES)

GALAN – Slow to begin.

GEEGEE'S BIG BIRD – Jumped awkwardly.

ROYAL AND TOUGH – Slow to begin, over-raced in the middle stages.

GOLDEN SOIL – Jumped very awkwardly and lost ground, slow to muster early speed. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no abnormalities. Trainer E Batt was advised that a warning would be placed on the record of the filly for being uncompetitive.

SAKURA HIME – Raced wide without cover throughout.

SISTINE – Jumped awkwardly, over-raced in the early stages.

RACE 2 – JACKSON SECURITY TASMANIANN NEWMARKET 30TH NOVEMBER MAIDEN (1220 METRES)

KAYTEE VALIENTE – Lost the near fore shoe in running.

NIGHT MISSILE – Jumped awkwardly and was slow into stride as a result. Rider L Riordan explained after beginning slowly he settled further back than anticipated. He further added that he had intended to trail THE CONTAMINATOR into the home straight however he assessed that VIVRE IS THE WORD was travelling better and elected to trail that runner and obtain clear running to its outside. Rider L Riordan further added that he recommended to connections for the gelding to step up in trip and race with the addition of ear muffs next start.

ROCKIERRO – Performed below market expectations. Rider S Carr could provide no explanation for the performance. She further added that gelding had made the

home turn awkward and in her opinion that the gelding had trialled poorly and that she was at a loss as to the apparent market support. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to be lame in the near fore. Trainer S Carr was advised that a veterinary clearance would be required prior to the gelding being permitted to race again.

SPECIAL INTEREST – Jumped very awkwardly resulting in its rider becoming unbalanced and losing ground.

FIRE TIGRESS – Inconvenienced near the 800m by MISS RED which when over racing shifted out marginally. A post-veterinary examination revealed the mare to have a poor post race recovery.

MISS RED – Near the 800m commenced to over-race and had to be steadied by its rider.

SOULITA – Raced wide without cover throughout. Forced wide rounding the home turn.

RACE 3 – BECOME A MEMBER AND ENJOY THE BENEFITS MAIDEN – (1620 METRES)

AMERICAN JEWEL – Slow to begin.

CORONATION APACHE – Hung out throughout.

JUST FOR CURIOSITY – Held up for a distance approaching and passing the 200m.

MACS RELAXED – Jumped awkwardly and shifted in. Raced wide without cover throughout. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no abnormalities. Trainer S Carr was advised that a warning would be placed on the record of the gelding for being uncompetitive.

SOUTHERN WIND – Held up rounding the home turn.

UPWARD AND ONWARD – Threw its head in the air on jumping.

GAYNIK – Jumped awkwardly. Rider dropped his whip rounding the home turn. A post-veterinary examination revealed no abnormalities.

GEEGEE'S SUNSHINE – Near the 1200m was steadied when awkwardly placed on the heels of PREWINGO (M Ulucinar) which shifted in when not clear. M Ulucinar was advised to exercise more care. Performed below market expectations. Apprentice T Johnstone advised was unable to offer an explanation for the poor performance other than the gelding did not appreciate racing in such close proximity with other runners. She further added that in her opinion the gelding may have come to the end of its preparation. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a poor post race recovery.

RACE 4 – LADBROKES PUNTERS ASSIST CLASS 1 HCP – (1620 METRES)

KING ISLAND – Over-raced in the middle stages.

NEEDS REMEMBERING – Slow to begin and failed to muster speed. Performed below market expectations. Rider B McCoull advised the gelding failed to muster in the early stages and settled further back than anticipated. He further added that when he placed the gelding under pressure from the 600m it failed to respond and from this point he desisted from placing it under any more pressure. Rider B McCoull further added that the gelding was making a respiratory noise post-race. Stewards questioned trainer A Trinder in relation to the below market performance. Mr Trinder stated that the gelding in his opinion may have come to the end of its preparation and it was his intentions now to spell the gelding. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a poor post recovery. A post-race swab sample was taken.

OLYMPIC HONOUR – Jumped awkwardly.

MAGIC TYPHOON – Bumped on jumping. Rider L Riordan advised that the mare raced keenly and was inclined to hang out. He further added that in his opinion the mare may have come to the end of its preparation.

GOOGA THE GOAT – Bumped on jumping, over-raced in the early and middle stages.

GREYLING – Declared a late scratching at 12.05pm due to an elevated temperature. Trainer S Berger was advised that a veterinary certificate will be required prior to racing again.

RACE 5 – ROBYN WISHAW BM76 HCP – (1620 METRES)

MYWORDIS – Performed below market expectations. Rider lost whip near 200m. Rider S Carr advised that the gelding hung out throughout and when it was placed under pressure the gelding failed to respond. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a poor post-race recovery.

FREELANCER – Raced three wide without cover throughout. Tactics queried. Apprentice C Baker advised that after beginning she rode the gelding forward in an attempt to obtain a forward position in accordance with her instructions. She further added that after attempting to obtain a forward position she was caught three wide and she felt that it she may have used her mount up if she attempted to go forward and obtain the lead. Stewards advised that in similar positions whereby the tempo is slow that she would be expected to use her mount and obtain a forward position instead of covering excess ground.

SO ASTOUNDING – Tactics queried near the 800m. Rider G Catania advised that near the 800m when BELL RINGER BOY proceeded to improve to her outside she was content in the position she was trailing MYWORDIS however when that horse failed to improve, she was unable to improve. She added in hindsight it may have been beneficial to improve to the outside however she was mindful of the gelding having a tendency to weaken when improving to the outside.

ENCOSTA FIORENTE – Jumped awkwardly.

RACE 6 – FIELD FAMILY CLASS 3 HCP - (1420 METRES)

POWER MAGNUM – Jumped awkwardly. Over-raced in the early and middle stages. Rider M Ulucinar advised that in his opinion the gelding failed to handle the quick back up from Friday 21 October 2022. Trainer J Blacker advised that the gelding will now be spelled. A post-race veterinary examination revealed

HERO OF ROMANI – Performed below market expectations. Rider B McCoull could provide no explanation for the poor performance. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a slow post race recovery. Trainer A Trinder advised it was his opinion that the gelding had come to the end of its preparation and it was his intentions to now spell the gelding.

MAARKLE – Held up for clear running until the 150 metres.

GEE GEE RHYTHM – Slow to begin. Raced wide without cover throughout.

LADY – Jumped awkwardly.

RACE 7 – KACHOO FASHION BM60 HCP - (1220 METRES)

TERRACOTTA – Jumped awkwardly.

MARIPOSA – Slow to begin. Over-raced in the early and middle stages. Apprentice B Hanham was advised to refrain from using the whip on the mare and to ride hands and heels.

RACE 8 – 7TAS BM60 HCP – (2150 METRES)

POLITICAL – Performed below market expectations. Rider T Baker advised that the gelding hung out from the 1000 metres and was disappointed. He further added that in his opinion the gelding races best on rain effected tracks. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to be lame in the left fore. Trainer S Carr was advised a veterinary clearance would be required prior to racing again.

DIXIE'S BOY – Brushed the running rail near the 800 metres. Stewards inquired into an incident near the 800m whereby it appeared that DIXIE'S BOY was checked when tightened. After considering the evidence from the riders and viewing the official patrol footage, stewards could not attribute any blame to one particular rider. Stewards nonetheless advised MALEVOLENT (B Neto) and GEE GEE ENUF SPEED (Apprentice T Johnstone) to be mindful that they are clear when they shift ground.

MALEVOLENT – Raced wide without cover throughout. Rider B Neto was questioned on the below market expectations performance of the gelding. Rider B Neto believed that in his opinion the gelding which was having its first start over the 2150 metres had failed to run out the distance. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

GEE GEE SILENTNITE – A post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to have poor post race recovery.
