## *Comments / Explanations:*

#### RACE 1 – 12.35PM – LADBROKES FORM GENIUS MAIDE /CLASS 1 – 2150 METRES

2. MATEUS	Bounded outwards upon jumping. A post race winning swab sample was taken from the gelding.
3. UNNERVING	Became fractious in the barriers prior to the start. Delayed the start as the bit burr became undone and was removed.

4. ALPINE TROUT	Rolled inwards making the first turn out of the straight on the first occasion tightening another runner.
5. TOSEN FAME	Raced 3 and 4 wide throughout. Stewards questioned the rider.
7. FLORENCE GLASS	Tightened for room racing out of the front straight on the first occasion.

# **8. MANHATTEN NIGHTS** Jumped awkwardly and restrained shortly after the start to gain a position closer to the rail.

Stewards questioned apprentice J Johnson into reason why he raced three and four wide throughout the event when there was an opportunity to gain a position closer to the rail in the early stages.

Apprentice J Johnson explained that the instructions were to attempt to lead if possible and in the early stages the mare tended to over race. Approaching the 1600m he again attempted to try for the lead and was unable to gain this position and was forced wider from the runner to his inside. Apprentice J Johnson said he placed the mare under pressure at the 500m and failed to respond to his riding and further explained he was mindful he was stuck wide for most of the race and reverted to hands and heels only.

Stewards after viewing the official patrol films and taking the evidence into consideration were satisfied with the explanation and took no action.

## RACE 2 – 1.08PM – LADBROKES MATESMODE POTS MAIDEN - 1220 METRES)

2. MISTER MANIHI	Raced 3 wide in the middle stages. Had to restrain off hels momentarily in the home straight.
4. STAR WALKIN	Shifted outwards under pressure in the run to the finish. A post race winning swab sample was taken from this gelding.
5. LIGHT FORCE	Raced three wide in the middle stages with cover. Tended to lay inwards in the home straight.
10. VANSITTART	Held up for a clear run entering the home straight for the run to the finish.
12. LADY FERN	Held up for a clear run approaching the home turn and entering the home straight. Hopelessly held up for a clear run over the vital stages and only gained a clear run over the final 50m.
14. SEDATIOUS AWARD	Tightened between runners at the start.
15. GUBER	Slow to begin and missed it by 2 lengths.

### RACE 3 – 1.47PM – HAPPY BIRTHDAY AIDAN & TRISTAN (C1) HCP - 1220 METRES

- **1. ANTHEIA** It proved difficult to load into the barriers. The trainer was advised a warning will be issued on the mare's barrier manners. Jumped inwards at the start.
- **3.NO ARGUMENT** Tended to over race in the early stages.

4. PEAK A BOOM	Tended to over race in the early and middle stages. Raced 4 wide from the 600m to the home turn.
5. FLUFFY'S GIRL	Bumped with another runner upon jumping. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner.
6. WILD NIGHTS	Bumped with another runner upon jumping. Over raced in the early stages of the event.
8. GEE GEES CHORIS	Slow to begin and missed it by 2 lengths.

#### RACE 4 - 2.22PM - FAMILY FUN FAIR AT MOWBRAY FROM 23RD APRIL 9 (C2) HCP -1620METRES

2. HARTFELT-	Was a late scratching at 2.24pm at the barriers due to becoming cast while in the barriers and given the time its leg was over into the next barrier partition was withdrawn on veterinary advise. Trainer A Trinder was advised that the gelding must trial to the satisfaction of the stewards before being nominated to race again. The trainer advised stewards that the gelding may go for a short spell.
3. WILLINGLY	
	Raced 4 wide from the 600m.
4. LONTANO 5. RALPH THE ROCKET	Stewards ordered a post race veterinary examination of the gelding. LANTANO was found to be lame in its right foreleg. A veterinary certificate of soundness will be required prior to being nominated to race.
6. STEELE MY SUNSHINE	A post race swab sample was taken from this winner.
7.I'M KEEFE	Tended to over race in the early stages.
9. MARTINI BLUE	Laid out under pressure in the home straight and had to be straightened by its rider.
	Stewards approved for the rider to ride the gelding 1kg over its minimum 54kg allotted weight. Dwelt upon jumping and was slow to muster early speed.

On the announcement of correct weight, stewards ordered that all monies invested on HARTFELT be refunded, with the following deductions to apply to successful wagers placed prior to 2.24pm. Stewards ordered that the following deductions would apply:

#### RACE 5 – 2.56 PM- HAPPY EASTER FROM THE TAS TURF CLUB - BM 60 HCP- 1220 METRES

**1. GEE GEE CAN WIN** Severely bumped upon jumping.

4. FLYING BILLIE	Tended to over race in the early and middle stages of the event.
5. KIREINA MARUBRAH	Raced three wide from the 600m to the home turn.
6. LI'L HAIL MARY	Became fractious in the barrier prior to the start.
10. SANDUAL	Bounded on jumping and tended to over race in the early and middle stages of the event.
11. EASTCOAST MISS	A post race swab sample was taken from this winner.
15. SHALL WE PLAY	Stewards ordered a post race veterinarian examination of the mare as the rider eased her out from the race approaching the 200m. The rider explained the mare was making a respiratory noise and was concerned so it was eased from the event.
	A veterinary report revealed the mare laboured breathing with an incurred respiratory noise. The mare also was found to be lame in its near hind leg. The trainer was advised that the mare will require a veterinary certificate of fitness prior to being nominated to trial or race. A trial to the satisfactory of stewards will also be required.

Stewards questioned trainer Mark Everett into to improved winning performance of the mare EASTCOAST MISS. Trainer explained that the mare has had feet and joint problems previously and has rectified these problems over time. Mr. Everett further explained that the mare had worked extremely well during the week and the beach work helped and wasn't surprised to see her winning on her work. Stewards were satisfied with the trainer's explanation and noted his comments for future reference.

#### RACE 6 – 3.31PM – TED & ARTHUR COX MEMORIAL BM64 HCP - 1420 METRES

1. MAKE A DECISSION	Contacted the running rail approaching the 400m.Held up for a clear run in the home straight before shifting outwards to gain clear running.
2.DAYAN STAR	A post race swab sample was taken from this winner.
3. SH'BOURNE MIDNIGHT	It was restrained at the start to take up a position closer to the rail and began to over race in the early stages. The rider was questioned regarding the performance of the gelding who was supported in the market to favoritism. Apprentice L Bingley stated that the gelding over raced in the run and bumped with another runner at the 900m. She further stated that she was given no favors during the running of the event and raced keenly throughout.
7. RIGOLETTO	Bumped with another runner at the 900 meters.

#### RACE 7 – 4.05PM – BOOK YOUR OUTSIDE FUNCTION @ THE LADBROKES RACING CENTRE CLASS 1 HCP- 1420 METRES

**3. SHAMUS EAGLE** Became fractious prior to the start.

4. THIN RED LINE	Brushed another runner upon jumping. Shifted ground inwards at the 1200m momentarily tightening another runner.
6. RICH GLOW	A post race swab sample was taken from the gelding after its winning performance.
8. BILLIE THE GREAT	Tended to over race in the early stages of the event. Raced 4 wide for most of the event.
9.FREDDY'S'SAJETSTAR	Tightened for room at the1200m. Commenced to over race in the middle stages of the event.
11. MISS PRIVATE	Stewards agreed to allow the rider to ride the mare 1 kg over its allotted minimum weight. Jumped awkwardly and brushed another runner.
14. CARNELIAN ROCK	Slow into stride

Stewards questioned trainer M Beamish into the improved performance of RICH GLOW. Trainer M Beamish explained that the gelding ran over 1400m and drew barrier 14 at its last start, and on this occasion drew barrier 2 which suited the gelding. The trainer further explained that he expected the gelding to probably win going on its previous race start which was a super run. Stewards were satisfied with the trainer's explanation and noted his comments for future reference.

#### RACE 8 – 4.41PM– THE SPORTIES'S STAFF SAYS HAPPY EASTER OPEN HCP- 1420 METRES

- **1. FIRST ACCUSED** Raced three wide in the middle stages. Rolled inwards and bumped another runner making the home turn. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner
- **3. JAGUAR STONE** Jumped awkwardly.
- **5. ZEWINNA** Knuckled upon jumping. Raced 4 wide from the 500m to the home turn. Stewards ordered a post race veterinarian examination after the mare failed to run on over the concluding stages. The examination failed to reveal any obvious abnormalities at the time of inspection.
- **7. SAILOR (NZ)** Brushed another runner on the home turn when it rolled in marginally.

#### RACE 9 – 5.19 PM– THANK YOU JOHN MCKENNER CLASS 6 - 1120 METRES)

1. GEEGEE JET BY	Brushed with another runner shortly after the start.
2. WARICA	Became fractious in the barriers before the start. Jumped outwards upon jumping.
3. BOLD INSTINCT	Brushed with another runner shortly after the start. Tended to over race in the early stages.
4. IN THE OCEAN	A post race swab sample was taken from this winner.
5.INTISAR	Became fractious in the barriers. It was slow to begin.
