Breeding, Race Injury and Retirement

Quarterly Report

April to June 2023



1. Overview

The data are derived from the *OzChase* system, on-track veterinarian and race-day stewards' reports. Information is the property of the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania - Office of Racing Integrity (ORI) and is relevant to Tasmanian greyhound racing activities.

The following information is provided in this report as a routine disclosure:

- 1. Statistics on greyhound pups whelped and named as reported by owners and recorded by ORI.
- 2. Statistics on injuries occurring to racing greyhounds at race meetings held in Tasmania during the reporting period. The race-related injury data are sourced from on-track veterinarians' and stewards' reports, and *OzChase* system reports.
- 3. Statistics on death/euthanasia of racing greyhounds because of injuries received at race meetings held in Tasmania during the reporting period. This includes greyhounds injured in races, who received off site treatment and assessment but were subsequently euthanised within a 14-day period from the date of injury. The data is sourced from ontrack veterinarians' and stewards' reports, and OzChase system reports.
- 4. Greyhound retirement notifications (including deaths) as reported by greyhound owners to ORI and held in *OzChase* as at the end of the reporting period.

Note: Injury Categories

Greyhounds injured or involved in incidents at Tasmanian race meetings are examined by ontrack veterinarians. These incidents and actions are reported to the ORI and included in the stewards' reports for each race meeting.

Injuries vary from very minor incidents with no treatment or incapacitation (stand down) period required to severe injuries that result in the death or euthanasia of a greyhound. Mandatory stand down periods allow for injury recovery before a greyhound is permitted to race again.

Injuries are categorised relative to the outcome – that is, the period of incapacitation (stand down) or death/euthanasia.

2. Greyhound pups born (whelped) and named from April 2023 to June 2023

During the period April 2023 to June 2023, there were 83 greyhound pups born (whelped) (Table 1) and 56 greyhounds named (Table 2) in Tasmania.

It is important to note that greyhounds are generally named for racing at between 12 and 18 months of age. This delay between whelping and naming means that the data in Table 2 does not relate to the same individual greyhounds as the data in Table 1.

3. Total reported injuries to racing greyhounds from April 2023 to June 2023

Reported greyhound racing-related injuries from April 2023 to June 2023

Injury rates are standardised as injuries per 1,000 starts. Every greyhound is counted each time it races in the reporting period to standardise injuries per 1,000 starts. During the period April 2023 to June 2023, there were 39 greyhound race meetings held at Tasmanian venues. At these race meetings, there were a total of 2993 starts.

Reported greyhound racing-related deaths from April 2023 to June 2023

Racing fatalities are defined as deaths that occur because of injuries and/or incidents during or immediately following a race (on track). These include injuries that resulted in the euthanasia of greyhounds at a race meeting. The data does not include euthanasia that may occur subsequent to race meetings when further diagnostic advice or treatment is sought.

5. Greyhounds reported as retired, deceased, or euthanised during April 2023 to June 2023

Greyhounds that are retired from racing, rehomed, or euthanised are recorded in the OzChase database. These notifications are self-reported by owners to the ORI. The last registered owner of the greyhound must submit a notification of retirement, death or euthanasia as specified by Greyhounds Australasia Rule 22.

Caveats:

- Reports of retirements from *OzChase* may vary over time for the same data set due to late lodgment of retirement notifications.
- Data for greyhounds retired to adoption programs other than the GAP are currently not available unless provided by owners in the greyhound's retirement notification.
