# STEWARDS INQUIRY DECISION

Charge(s):	Mr John Hall whilst licensed as a stable-hand and undertaking horse handling duties at Seven Mile Beach on 19 June 2019 was found to have the presence of banned substances in a urine sample provided
Prohibited Substance:	11-nor-delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol-9-carboxylic-acid, d-amphetamine methamphetamine
Inquiry Decision:	Mr Hall's stable-hands licence was suspended for a period of three months.

## FACTS:

Mr John Hall whilst licensed as a stable-hand and undertaking horse handling duties at Seven Mile Beach on 19 June 2019 was found to have the presence of banned substances in a urine sample provided

### INQUIRY:

On 23 September 2019, Office of racing Integrity (ORI) Stewards concluded an inquiry into the analyst's results.

Submissions were made by Mr John Hall. After considering all the evidence presented, Stewards issued a charge under Australian Rule of Racing 140(1) (a) which reads:

### AR140 Offences where horse handlers use banned substances

- (1) A horse handler breaches these Australian Rules if:
- (a) A banned substance under AR 137(1) is detected in a sample taken from the horse handler.

Mr John Hall pleaded guilty to the charge at the earliest opportunity.

### **DECISION:**

The following submissions were taken into consideration when assessing penalty

- Personal circumstances
- 28 years employment in the industry
- Clean record
- Forthright evidence

Stewards also took into account that any penalty must act as a specific deterrent to Mr Hall and a general deterrent to the racing industry.

After consideration of those factors Mr Hall's stable-hands licence was suspended for a period of three months, backdated to commence on the 10<sup>th</sup> of July 2019 at which time he was stood down from horse handling duties. Mr Hall was further notified that he must provide a clear sample of his urine prior to being re-licensed to undertake horse handling duties.

Mr Hall was advised of his right to appeal.
