RACE 1 – MAGNUM PARK PACE – 1609m Mobile

SPORT WATCHER – Will be excluded from the barrier draw in mobile start events after breaking gait shortly after the start.

FLYING VINNIE – First registered race start.

SPORTS READER – First registered race start. Sulky contacted by ZEUS IMMORTAL approaching the 900.

MEL RUSTY KITA – Inconvenienced when ZEUS IMMORTAL shifted out and broke gait approaching the 900.

ZEUS IMMORTAL – First registered race start. Tended to race green, hanging out. Shifted out and contacted the sulky wheel of SPORTS READER before breaking gait. Placed on its last chance to race truly.

RACE 2 – LADBROKE BLACKBOOK PACE – 2090m Mobile

HUNT A RAINBOW – Driven forward from the start. Short, unsuccessful challenge for the lead near the 1600. Hung out at times.

IDEAL SON – Began well, securing the early lead. Resisted short challenge for this position near the 1600.

RACE 3 – KELSAND SADDLERY PACE – 1609m Mobile

OBLER – Led early, unable to hold lead racing into first turn.

LEWICKI LEIS – Held up for clear running until able to utilise the sprint lane.

DISTINCTIVE STRIDE – Raced rough approaching the start and again shortly after the start was effected. Driven forward soon after, racing to the lead approaching the 1300.

RACE 4 – KRISTY BUTLER EQUINE SPORTS THERAPY PACE – 1609m Mobile

ARDEN ROANOKE NZ – Raced to the early lead where it over-raced and pulled hard.

RACE 5 – DEFIBRILLATOR LODGE PACE – 2090m Stand

General: The start of this race was delayed so as to avoid a clash with a NSW Greyhound event.

ALL FOR DAVE – Stepped away well, securing the lead.

WATTABOUT SPANGHER – Broke gait free of interference shortly after the strands were released. A warning was issued.

MESSERATI – Unsuccessful at securing a forward marker peg position early in the event. Restrained to a rearward position leaving the 1700.

PUNTARNO STRIDE – Galloped out when the strands were released. Will continue to be excluded from the barrier draw in standing start events.

COOL WATER PADDY NZ – Utilised the sprint lane in the run to the finish.

General: Driver M Yole was fined \$100 for whilst leading with ALL FOR DAVE he failed to adhere to the minimum time standards [AHR Rule 162(1)(y)].

RACE 6 – ANNE CAMPBELL MEMORIAL PACE – 1609m Mobile

SOUTHERN LUCK – Broke gait free of interference racing toward the first turn, checking a number of runners. Continued to race rough for the remainder of the event. Subjected to a post-race Veterinary Examination, on inspection Dr Buckerfield could find no obvious abnormalities. SOUTHERN LUCK was placed on its last chance to race truly.

MOTH HUNTER – Checked racing into the first turn when SOUTHERN LUCK broke gait.

HELANSIN – Checked racing into the first turn when SOUTHERN LUCK broke gait. As a consequence HELANSIN shifted in resulting in its sulky wheel striking markers.

YARECKON IM SWEET – Checked racing into the first turn when SOUTHERN LUCK broke gait.

RACE 7 – WILLREV SYNDICATE PACE – 2090m Mobile

NO NUKE SKIPPER – Tightened and raced rough near the 250 when MISTER FINNIGAN shifted in, this resulted in NO NUKES SKIPPER shifting in and its sulky contacting markers.

MISTER FINNIGAN – Tightened near the 250 as MONEYS NO ISSUE moved in toward the markers, shifting in which in turn tightened the racing room of NO NUKES SKIPPER.

General: Stewards questioned drivers M Howlett (MONEYS NO ISSUE), M Yole (NO NUKES SKIPPER) and D Ford (MISTER FINNIGAN) into the reason why NO NUKES SKIPPER raced rough, shifted in and contact markers. At the inquiry it was established that through simultaneous movement of MONEYS NO ISSUE and MISTER FINNIGAN where both drivers were aiming for the one-out line. This movement caused a tightening to MISTER FINNIGAN carrying it down the track, brushing the off-fore leg of NO NUKES SKIPPER, causing that gelding to race rough and shift in when in restricted room. On considering all the evidence, Stewards could not place blame on any one driver nor horse and as such took no action other than note the circumstances.

RACE 8 – EFFECTIVE MAINTENANCE PACE – 2090m Mobile

ELENNA – Unsuccessfully challenged for the early lead, left leading the one-out line. Under pressure from the 800, beaten in excess 70 metres. Subjected to a post-race Veterinary Examination, on inspection Dr Buckerfield could find no obvious abnormalities, with a normal recovery rate. Dr Buckerfield did however show some concern with evidence of old/past leg issues. SOUTHERN LUCK was placed on its last chance to race competitively.

RACE 9 – FREEMAN SPRING RACING PACE – 2090m Mobile

No Racing Incidents

Supplemental: At the completion of the meeting, trainer W Yole informed Stewards that he was extremely disappointed with the manner the majority of his team failed to finish off their races, both at tonight's and Friday night's race meetings. He added he will undertake the assessment of all horses in his stable over the ensuing days and report back to Stewards with any concerns that may arise. Further, Mr Yole informed Stewards he will be looking at altering his training and feeding regime as well as the racing programming for all his team.
